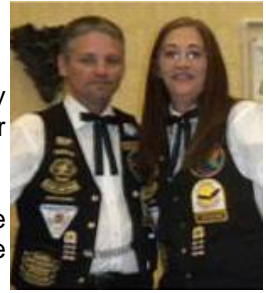

By people attending the OCP we believe this not only makes GWRRA stronger but will make Chapters stronger.

Dana went over to view Denis Turcotte & Darla Williams complete their requirements to become Leadership Training Instructors. The Chapter showed up in force to learn something new about GWRRA. We still have 6 more Prospective Instructors that will be completing the requirements over the next few months. By the end of the year, the Florida District will have 34 Certified Instructors around the state - and we do mean around the state! Right now the District has Instructors in the Panhandle, on the East Coast from as far North as Jacksonville all the way to Miami and locations in between. The West Coast is covered from North to South.

So why does it really matter that the District has Instructors in all these areas? We believe it matters because if a Chapter wants training in their area we as a District can provide it. To get any of the training is as simple as asking. That's right, just give us a call or send an email and we will get something set-up for your Chapter.

One of the questions that continue to come up is, Who can attend the OCP? The simple answer is... any GWRRA Member! Yes, the OCP is designed to certify Officers to assume the positions as Director or Assistant Director but the program is open to any Member that wishes to take it.

In closing, due to a number of things going on, we are cancelling the Horizon Program scheduled for October. We will get the word out to everyone as soon as we have a new date.

It seems that only a few Members were aware of this option. We want to know how it works for you too Florida. Please let us know good or bad, what your experience was if you try this method of doing a Chapter Override.

The presentation went well and the Dunnellon Participants were appreciative. However, a situation was prevalent at this venue that made the presentation difficult. The section of the restaurant the Gathering was held in was small and was adjacent to an open area where a birthday party was taking place. There were some 20 adult partiers who were having a boisterously good time, as well they should.



Any Instructor will tell you, in order for there to be learning to take place, the atmosphere must be conducive to said learning. In other words, trying to convey a message while there are multiple distractions just doesn't work. Having attended many Chapter Gatherings and other functions throughout the District, I know this is a problem not strictly reserved for Dunnellon alone. Finding a restaurant willing to take us in once a month and having a room isolated enough to be able to conduct a Gathering unobstructed is an ongoing challenge.

Three of our Chapters are fortunate to have fairly isolated Gathering rooms. They are FL1-A (Tampa), FL1-L2 (Wesley Chapel) and FL1-T (Inverness). That's 50% of the Chapters in our area of responsibility. It wouldn't surprise me if this was a District, Region and International percentage as well. I in no way suggest that if your Gathering room isn't isolated it's anyone's fault. I am merely pointing out how difficult it is to find one that meets the standards we would like to adhere to.

So what's the answer? Perseverance, I guess. If your Participants are continually complaining, perhaps you (or they) should keep looking until you either find a Gathering venue to their liking or you run out of restaurants in your area and can convey that message.

Folks, I contend that GWRRA is one of the most friendly and social organizations anywhere. We should be constantly trying to improve ourselves in all areas. Let's not become complacent and satisfied with second best. If there is any area of improvement you can see in your Chapter, including Gathering facilities, let's do all we can to initiate that improvement. Thanks.

Group Riding for Street Bikes

Why?

There are several advantages for motorcyclists who ride street bikes in a group:

- A group is usually more visible to other drivers than a solo rider;
- Other vehicles can predict what a rider in a group will do because all members generally maintain fixed positions and fixed intervals between riders;
- In case of a mechanical problem or an accident, help is available immediately to the rider. A member of the group may carry a cell phone. Usually some riders in a group are trained in First Aid and CPR. They are often aware of safety information and accident management procedures that non-riders may not know -- for example, not to remove the helmet of a downed rider unless breathing is inhibited, where to find particular medical information for a downed rider; how to manage an accident scene to prevent complications, etc.; and
- It can be a lot more FUN!



In addition, motorcyclists tend to learn a great deal from each other about their sport. Planned stops along the way offer a fine opportunity to socialize and to share valuable tips and techniques.

Why Not?

Group riding is not for everyone. It requires a certain level of skill and self-discipline. It restricts an individual rider's options as to speed, changes in route, and lane positioning. To attempt to ride in a group without having good basic riding skills and a good sense of what others in the group are likely to do -- and what they expect you to do -- is an invitation to an accident, one that may involve damage and injuries to more than one bike and one rider. It is also a matter of personality, in that group riding requires good communications, courtesy among riders and a willingness to look out for the safety of others while riding your own ride. Those who don't wish to ride in a group but who wish to arrive at the same destination as their friends may serve as a scout if they have a CB radio, or they may just prefer to travel solo and meet up with their friends at the day's end..

People who ride in a group usually appreciate knowing what they are expected to do, and what to expect from others who are taking part in a hazardous sport in close proximity to them. Road Captains and those who frequently ride lead or drag are particularly urged to become familiar with these terms and guidelines in order to explain them to other riders who may show up for a scheduled ride without having any group riding experience.

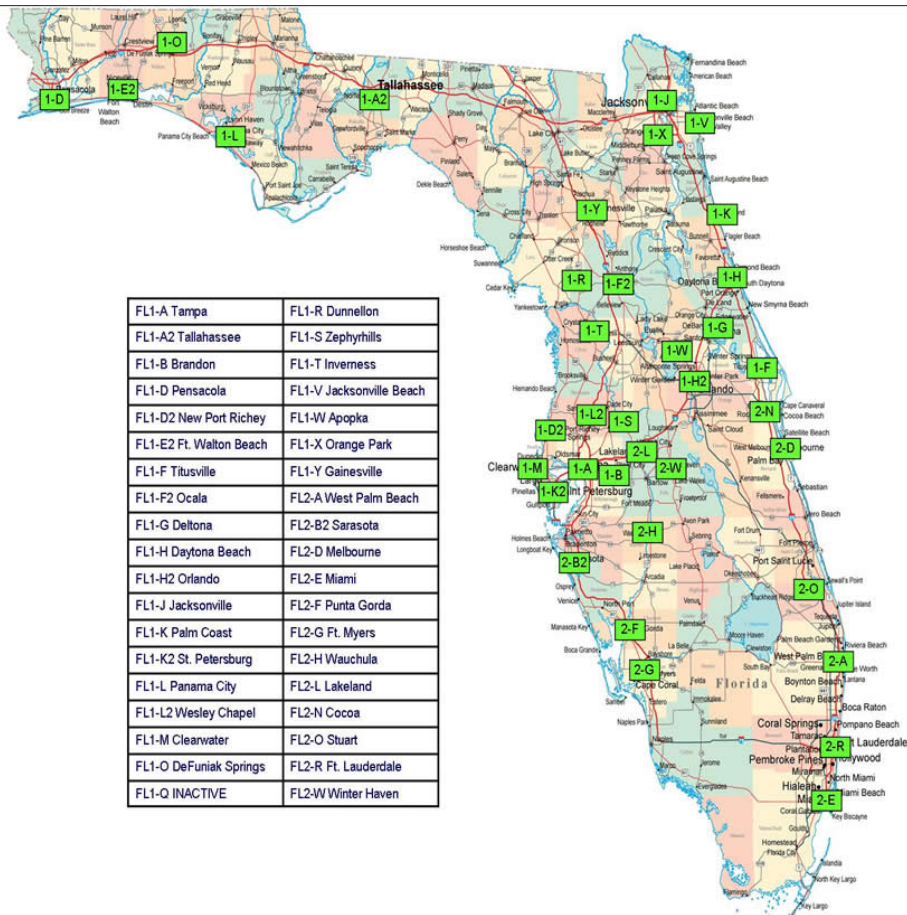
